<p><b>Personalized assistance</b> From the PRESHCO Program Staff to help you prepare for your study abroad experience, answer questions about the academic program, provide course syllabi and assist with your flights.</p>	<p><b>Tuition</b> PRESHCO program courses taught by Spanish professors at the humanities campus and direct enrollment in classes at the University of Córdoba with Spanish students.</p>	<p><b>Host family</b> Your family will speak with you in Spanish, introduce you to Spanish culture and include you in family outings. If you are placed with another student, you will still have your own room.</p>	<p><b>Cultural classes</b> Co-curricular classes in traditional Andalusian dance (“Sevillanas”), guitar, theater, photography and studio art (drawing, ceramics, sculpture, leather-making, etc.)</p>	<p><b>Flights</b> Group flight from Boston or New York or a reimbursement up to \$900 for round trip airfare from anywhere. PRESHCO can help book your flights from your home airport.</p>	<p><b>Access to UCO facilities</b> Includes use of libraries, computer services, sports facilities, and other student services. There is also an active Erasmus club that plans outings and trips throughout the semester.</p>
<p><b>Pre-departure resources</b> Full information online including course descriptions, social media posts, handbook and remote orientation are just some of the resources available to you prior to departure.</p>	<p><b>Books and materials</b> Complimentary course textbooks and selected class materials for PRESHCO courses. Cultural fund can be used to off-set the cost of university course textbooks and materials.</p>	<p><b>Meals</b> Host families will provide 3 delicious home cooked meals per day. Most dietary restrictions can be accommodated.</p>	<p><b>Cultural fund</b> Funds for individually selected cultural activities, personal travel in Spain, and incidentals, such as gym memberships and books.</p>	<p><b>Orientation tour</b> Under normal circumstances, a pre-session excursion will introduce you to Spain. All ground transportation, hotel, meals, and entrances/tour guides to group-related historic sites are included.</p>	<p><b>Internship opportunities</b> Intended to enhance your cultural experience and your resume, these optional placements are with local organizations. It is another excellent way to practice Spanish and meet locals.</p>
<p><b>Student networking resources</b> Enable you to connect with other students who will be going on your program, as well as PRESHCO alumni who can provide first-hand information and advice on what to expect.</p>	<p><b>Intensive language and culture course</b> Remote or in-person sessions about language and culture to prepare students for study at the University of Córdoba.</p>	<p><b>Laundry</b> Host families will do your laundry at least once per week. Linens and towels are provided by the family, although you may want to bring your own travel towel.</p>	<p><b>Conversation partners</b> Spanish students with whom you will be paired through facilitated activities and events. This is an excellent way to practice your Spanish and form a social network with Spanish peers.</p>	<p><b>Program excursions</b> Several day and overnight excursions to enhance and enrich your experience. All ground transportation, hotel, meals, and entrances/tour guides to group-related historic sites are included.</p>	<p><b>Medical insurance</b> Major medical insurance including emergency medical and evacuation insurance. Access to mental health resources is also available.</p>
<p><b>Spanish visa advising</b> Help with the Spanish visa process, including. In normal circumstances, PRESHCO may be able to apply on your behalf if you live or study in the jurisdiction of the Boston Consulate.</p>	<p><b>Spanish tutors</b> Spanish graduate students who can help you with academic work and with language practice.</p>	<p><b>Internet access</b> Each house will have internet access, and you will also have access at the University and in all PRESHCO facilities.</p>	<p><b>End of semester celebration</b> Dinner reception and show for students, faculty, host families and friends of the program at the end of the semester. You will have a chance to show off your guitar or sevillana dancing skills!</p>	<p><b>Local transportation</b> Travel by bus or train to other University of Córdoba campuses to take classes is reimbursable.</p>	<p><b>On-site support staff</b> There is a Resident Director and 3 full-time student services staff to support you throughout your stay, help with any questions or advice you may need while in Córdoba.</p>



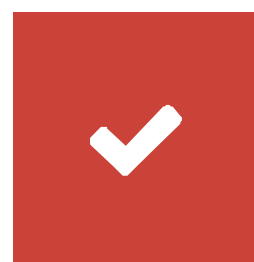
# Not included in the PRESHCO program fee

Additional spending money and personal travel expenses are typically not included in the calculation of financial aid, and you must expect to save for these expenses outside of what your financial aid will provide. The amount of additional funds needed depends greatly on your personal spending habits and can vary widely from student to student.



## Visa and passport fees

Passport fees for U.S. citizens: \$145 and visa fees for U.S. citizens is \$160; most other nationalities are charged \$67.



## Personal spending money for travel

Varies considerably from student to student and the cultural fund may be used for travel in Spain.



## Daily living expenses

Varies considerably from student to student but a good estimate is \$50 weekly for items such as toiletries, taxis, coffees, etc.



## Books and materials for the University

University of Córdoba books and materials may cost between \$50-100, but you may use your cultural fund to defray the cost.
